The aim moving forward is for all communications to be done via the Parent Portal, including permissions for trips etc. This will take place over the course of this academic year.

I would also like to mention the guidelines we wish parents to follow regarding requesting work for children when they are at home. If your child is unwell then they should not be accessing online learning or completing work at home. If a child is self-isolating, then this is when they should access our blended learning arrangements and your child's class teacher will be in touch by 10.30 a.m. on the first day of absence to arrange this.

I was lucky enough to be able to attend the parent talk and felt reassured as both a mum and a teacher that the talks would be pitched appropriately and had appropriate (if challenging) content. ### Year 1

Next week in Year 1 we will build up to our Story Adventure on Friday. The children will receive a letter from me (in lesson time) explaining my request to take them on a walk and they will learn the different skills that are needed for them to reply. The children will also learn how to write a list of the kit that we need to take with us, and they will write instructions on how to prepare themselves for the walk. I am very excited about this adventure and I am sure the children will be too. I will also have a route card for them where they will be able to develop their map reading skills at the same time. Our aim is to gather everything that they need for them to create and write their own stories the week after next.

In Maths the children will continue to work on their measuring skills and apply this to real life situations. Perhaps the children can try measuring different things at home to support this learning!

### Year 2

Our sculpture theme continues next week looking at another local sculptor, Henry Moore. We will be making comparisons between his work and that of Barbara Hepworth. The children will finish their own clay sculptures and present their designs to the class.

In Maths we will be using Base 10/Dienes blocks to represent numbers with apparatus as well as in pictures. This will help to build on your child's understanding of place value. We will also be working on time, using analogue and digital clocks, as well as recording time in words. The children will be challenged to solve problems related to time as well as complete diaries about their day.

# WHAT ARE WE DOING IN PREP NEXT WEEK?

### Year 3

Year 3 have had another busy week and have impressed us with how hard they have been working. Next week we will focus on:

Maths: The children will be adding and subtracting 3 -digit numbers and multiples of 100.

English: We will continue to read our book 'The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane'. The children will 'hot seat' the character of Edward to help them empathise with his feelings to write a diary entry, about what it would be like to travel from America to England on the Queen Mary in the 1930s.

Topic: The children will write a postcard from their 'trip of a lifetime' to include what human and physical features they have seen on their travels and how long it took them to travel there.

Science: We will continue to explore food and teeth and the children will sample different pieces of food to identify which teeth they use and why.

### Year 4

Wow! Another fab week in Year4! We have been impressed by the children's knowledge of the Celts and all their super fact finding. This week we have focused our topic and English around diary writing and the daily life and jobs of the Celts. The children have also done some super number bond work.

We have set a piece of Topic homework for both this week and next which is to make a Celtic shield and the children have just over two weeks to do this and these don't need to be in till Wednesday the 14th. Next week:

English/Topic: Our English/Topic work will focus on looking at Celtic warriors and identifying different features. We also have a special event planned on Wednesday afternoon which will then focus the rest of our topic work...

Maths: We will be looking at using and applying different methods of addition in lots of different contexts. Science: Will continue to focus on different animals and species found around us.

### Year 5

This week we have talked about mental health and wellbeing, discussed strategies to support others if their wellbeing is suffering and considered how we can reframe negative thoughts in a positive way. In maths, the children will continue to work on methods of addition and subtraction. Science sees the children exploring the terms 'solstice' and 'equinox' as well as researching an element of Space which particularly interests them.

We have been thinking about the seasons and seasonal produce to tie in with Harvest - we would welcome any donations for the collection box in the foyer.

As we approach our D.T. week in the final week of the half term, please may we ask that you help your child to find an old garment that they wish to upcycle for their D.T. project?

Year 6 pupils have been working incredibly hard this week in all aspects of their learning and we are looking forward to a busy fortnight ahead leading up to half term. Next week pupils will continue to develop their fractions understanding in maths and we ask that homework continues to be completed, on time, to a high standard - both in terms of presentation and effort. We will carry on reading our class text in English and link the events and factual detail to our history topic.
