## Year 5

As well as taking part in a number of Christmassy activities, we will be 'wrapping up' all aspects of our learning this week, including reaching the climax and resolution of our ghostly Tudor tales. There will be a particular focus on the use of imagery to enhance descriptions and varying sentence lengths for effect. In maths, we will return to some of our previous learning in place value and calculation to practise and apply our skills. Our science learning will focus on reversible and irreversible changes that take place both in and around the home. We will perform several experiments to draw conclusions about these changes and why they occur.

We are all so proud of how the children have adapted so well to the changes implemented in school since our return in September. It has been a pleasure to be in school with them this term.

## Year 6

Year 6 are looking forward to their final week of this term. Amongst the Christmas build-up we will continue to work hard in all areas of the curriculum. Pupils will be continuing their descriptive writing about Ernest Shackleton's expedition to the South Pole, using high quality language and more complex sentence construction to bring alive the setting of 'Dog Town' where the expedition settled for several months in the Antarctic Summer of 1914. We will be encouraging the use of thesauruses and word banks. We will then investigate the reasons why the expedition was not the success it was supposed to be and what happened in the end. Our science work will continue to focus on adaptation and we will explore a range of polar creatures living at both Poles.

Pupils will continue to receive homework next week. After the Christmas break, pupils will begin to receive longer pieces of homework and/or more tasks set in a broader range of subjects. We would like all pupils to complete these tasks as independently as possible before asking for help and we will continue to encourage pupils to manage their own work and homework schedule for themselves. The best time to do homework is on the night it is set (unless it is a longer project) and in a quiet place with no distractions.
